Every year during Lent, our denomination (PCUSA) collects this special offering. What started as an hour-long radio appeal in 1949 has evolved over the years, varying from eight to 29 participating communions, and has grown to be the most participated-in offering in the PC(USA). One Great Hour of Sharing is an ecumenical effort aimed at raising the funds necessary to provide relief for those people who lack access to food, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. Each gift to One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) serves to help change the lives of people who are in these challenging situations. The offering provides us a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need.

Watch for more details during Lent. Offering envelopes will be available in the worship center. You may also contribute by writing a check payable to our church with "OGHS" in the memo. Donations may be given any time through March 31.
