### Screenings to be offered

### Sunday, February 5 Help Your Team!

On Sunday, February 5, we will again participate in the nationwide Souper Bowl of Caring, a day set aside to raise money and food items to combat hunger.

The Sunday School set up a football field collection area in the fellowship hall with friendly competition between the last names beginning with A-M versus N-Z. For every nonperishable food

item donated your team can move forward a yard from the 30 yard line. So 70 items would equal a touchdown (6 points). Please add to your score when you get a touchdown. Then, your team can go back to the 30 yard line and try to score more. Our local Human Services indicated they have a need for macaroni and cheese and pasta, but, of course, all items donated are appreciated. Also, for every package of diapers donated your team gets a field goal (3 points). Human Services has indicated a need for size 5 diapers.

The competition is heating up as the teams are neck and neck with only 3 points difference in the score. Plan to join this Sunday and bring in items to help lead your team to victory. We hope you have fun with this. One of our teams will get bragging rights for the year, but the real winner of this competition will be the local Human Services when we take donated items!

There will also be a monetary collection if you would rather participate in that way. The Sunday School class will collect cash after worship on February 5 or you can write a check to the church with "Souper Bowl" in the memo and either put it in the soup pots or place it in with the regular offering.
