Per Capita

Every year the local church sends in a "per capita" on each of our church members. KNOCK OUT HUNGER!

Since 1990, young people have been leading the charge and inspiring others to collect dollars and food in the weeks leading up to the Big Game. Teaming up with local partners, these groups give 100% of donations to local charities, changing the nation's largest weekend of football into the largest weekend of caring.

Souper Bowl of Caring was originally founded by a church youth group. Even though the movement has since expanded from the faith community to many types of participating groups, they continue to be fueled by those coming together to worship and make a difference in their community.

The Souper Bowl of Caring competition at First Presbyterian is back on. The teams will be last names A-L versus M-Z. Special guests will join us each week to give us more information about the need and ways we can help. The real winner of this competition is Human Services in Shelby County. All items and money collected stay right here to help our community.



Donation sites for the two teams will be at the front of the sanctuary until February 2, when this competition ends (although we expanded it a few weeks last year). Donated items should be placed on the side up front that corresponds with your last name. The local Human Services currently has a BIG need for personal hygiene items -- toilet paper, soap, body wash, deodorant, shampoo, toothbrushes and toothpaste, etc. Of course, any nonperishable food items are welcome in our competition as well. Toilet paper rolls in packages will be counted separately.



In 2018 we collected 750 items and \$478.75 in cash and in 2019 we collected 1100 items and \$289.81. Hopefully we will be even more successful in our donations this year so we can knock out hunger!
